Do we need to be parishioners at St. Ann Catholic Church?

What do I need:

Football Helmet that has a valid new or reconditioned date sticker on the back, Practice jersey in your team color (SLW-silver/gray, LW- Forrest green, JV- white, V-gold) practice pants, cleats, athletic cup, preferred mouth guard, any extra desired padding

What can I expect from a practice?

Football - While your coach can offer specifics about your team's practices, you can assume that practices will happen rain or shine, unless there is lightening nearby. Unless otherwise specified all practices will require full pads after the acclimation period. Practices will normally last two hours, and will include conditioning, scrimmages and football drills. Please bring plenty of water and dress accordingly for the weather. Parents are welcome to stay and watch.

What can I expect on game day?

Games start in the middle of August and run every weekend through early November. They could be held on either Saturday or Sunday. Generally, games start mid-morning with the Super Lightweight teams and progress to the older teams as the day goes on.

There are eight regular season games and up to four additional playoff games. Usually, about four of those are home games.

For home games St. Ann football and cheer families are welcome to line our home side lines. Bring your chairs, tents, and cheering voices. Games will be played in all weather unless there is lightening near by. Concessions provided by our very own home concession stand. Serving everything from hotdogs to walking tacos. The best in River Valley! The game schedule will be made available as soon as it is provided by the league.
